SEN. JOHN MCCOLLISTER

John McCollister grew up in Omaha and graduated from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln with a degree in Business Administration.

He then embarked on a 35-year career with McCollister & Co, a three-generation family business that manufactured lubricants for large commercial, industrial, and private label customers in fourteen Midwestern states.

From 1979 to 2008, McCollister served as a publically-elected member of the Metropolitan Utilities District Board of Directors, which provides natural gas and water to the Omaha area. In early 2009 McCollister was named executive director of the Platte Institute for Economic Research – a nonprofit free-market think tank.

In 2014 John was elected to the Nebraska Legislature. He is currently a member of the Legislature's Executive Board, the Banking and Insurance, the Government and the Military and Veterans Affairs Committees. He is also the Vice Chair of the Planning Committee. During his tenure in the Legislature, McCollister has promoted legislation for criminal justice reform, fighting food insecurity with expanded SNAP benefits, climate change remediation and promotion of renewable energy.

He also currently serves on the One World Health Center Board of Directors and the University of Nebraska Business College Advisory Board.

McCollister married Deborah Way in 1971 and they have three children: Lauren, Daniel and Jeffrey and two grandsons, Andrew and David.

Carolina Padilla, founder and Executive Director of the Intercultural Senior Center, provides leadership for the organization's growth, vision, and community reach. She is actively involved with all functions of the organization including fundraising, outreach, partnerships, program development, and direct services.

Carolina immigrated to the United States from Guatemala in 1992 with her husband and three children. Her educational background is in Communication Science. She worked for One World Community Health Centers for 12 years, moving through various health departments and administrative and leadership positions. Shortly after that, she was elected the Director of the Latina Resource Center, a program of Catholic Charities. Her primary responsibilities were to develop social service programs for younger adult women in need of basic skills in English as a Second Language, leading toward employment as well as services for women facing domestic violence.

During this time, Carolina realized that another segment of the population, Latino elders, were underserved. This was



the beginning of the Intercultural Senior Center.

Intercultural Senior Center opened its doors in South Omaha on March 19, 2009. During the 10 years of ISC's existence, Carolina has been a passionate advocate for the elderly of our community. Her contagious enthusiasm has created greater awareness and understanding of the need for services for the diverse aging population. Her determination in the cause she is serving has succeeded in attracting many like-minded friends and organizations who are now funding different programs and services when there was hardly any support during the early years.



WALTER "TED" CARTER

As the eighth president of the University of Nebraska, Ted Carter leads a four-campus university system that enrolls nearly 52,000 students and employs 16,000 faculty and staff on campuses in Lincoln, Omaha, and Kearney, plus academic divisions and research and extension centers across the state.

He serves as chief spokesman and chief executive officer for the system, which operates on a \$2.8 billion annual budget and includes a flagship Big Ten institution, a world-renowned academic health sciences center, Division I athletics programs, and preeminent institutes focused on water and agriculture, national security and defense, infectious disease and early childhood education. Carter brought with him a distinguished record in education, partnerships, and military service, having come to Nebraska from the U.S. Naval Academy, his alma mater, where he served as superintendent.

In his first year at the University of Nebraska, Carter led with a focus on the land-grant priorities of access and opportunity for students and families.

He launched the Nebraska Promise, a financial aid program guaranteeing free tuition for low- and middle-income Nebraskans, and implemented a multi-year budget plan that included a two-year, across-the-board tuition freeze. The result was system-wide growth in enrollment, including record gains among underrepresented students.

Carter oversaw the awarding of a \$92 million federal contract for the university's National Strategic Research Institute, one of only 14 University-Affiliated Research Centers in the country conducting exclusive research for the Department of Defense. During Carter's tenure, the NU system has been ranked among the world's top 100 institutions for earning research patents, the Omaha campus was selected as the home for a new federal counterterrorism research center, the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources launched a new effort focused on rural vitality, and the medical center opened an education, training and preparedness facility that positions Nebraska as the world leader in the fight against infectious disease.

DR. ALI KHAN

Dr. Ali S. Khan is the former Director of the Office of Public Health Preparedness and Response at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Since 2014, he has served as Dean of the College of Public Health and Retired Assistant Surgeon General at the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha, Nebraska.

Khan's federal career began in 1991 when he joined CDC and the U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps as an Epidemic Intelligence Service officer. Khan has focused his career on bioterrorism, global health, and emerging infectious diseases. While serving as the interim Director for CDC's global infectious disease activities, he designed CDC's joint global field epidemiology and laboratory training program. Khan helped design and implement the President's Malaria Initiative, a \$1.2 billion project to reduce the burden of malaria and relieve poverty in Africa. He has also been engaged in polio and guinea worm eradication. Khan proposed the BioPHusion program as a new public health initiative to improve knowledge exchange for all public health practitioners. BioPHusion was



used during the H1N1 pandemic to identify emerging cases and plan response actions.

In 1999, Khan helped establish the CDC's bioterrorism program, which upgraded local, state, and national public health systems to detect and rapidly respond to bioterrorism. As deputy director of the bioterrorism program, Khan created the Critical Agent list, which has remained the basis for all biological terrorism preparedness. Khan also published the first national public health preparedness plan, initiated syndrome-based surveillance, and designed key focus areas to improve local and state capacities to respond to emergencies. Khan used these preparedness efforts during the first anthrax attack in 2001, during which he directed the CDC operational response in Washington, D.C.

Before becoming Director of PHPR in 2010, Khan served as Deputy Director of CDC's National Center for Emerging and Zoonotic Infectious Diseases (NCEZID). He has responded to and led numerous domestic and international public health emergencies, including hantavirus pulmonary syndrome, Ebola hemorrhagic fever, monkeypox, Rift Valley fever, avian influenza, severe acute respiratory syndrome, the Asian tsunami, and the initial public health response to Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans.

Carmen Tapio, a global teleservices leader, is president and CEO of North End Teleservices, LLC, an organization that is the culmination of her passion for business and community. North End Teleservices takes a holistic view of everyone they employ; not only by helping them to create a vision for their lives and what is possible; but, also by helping them to achieve it.

Her leadership approach has translated into numerous accolades including Small Business of the Month, Business Excellence Small Business of the Year and Business Excellence in Innovation by the Greater Omaha Chamber of Commerce, Best Corporate Culture by the Urban League of Nebraska Young Professionals and the 2020 Urban League African American Leadership Award for Business. 
